We love National Punctuation Day (because it's as exciting as our birthday)!

Periods should be used in lists if the list items are sentences. Also, all items in the list should be either sentences or fragments, not a mixture of the two. To create a list that follows these rules, do the following:

- Use the minimum amount of words.
- Act like you know what you are talking about.
- Inject some humor.
